




Finding Community in Chaos

Barbara Jordan: In Pursuit of Truth and Justice

Barbara Jordan (October's Cover Quote) broke a lot of barriers in her lifetime, and her name is often paired with the word "FIRST." She was the first African American woman elected to the Texas state senate. She was the first African American Texan in Congress. She was the first African American woman from a Southern state to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives. She was the first to speak at the 1974 Judiciary Committee's impeachment hearing for then President Richard Nixon. Ms. Jordan gave a now famous 15-minute opening statement where she declared, "I am not going to sit here and be an idle spectator to the diminution, the subversion, the destruction of the Constitution."

In the early 1970s, in support of the Equal Rights Amendment, *Barbara Jordan* was likely one of the first government officials to ever recognize women who worked in the home as deserving of Social Security benefits based on their domestic labor. A recognition still not accepted. She was the first African American woman to deliver the keynote address to the Democratic National Convention in 1976. Ms. Jordan's words are not only as meaningful but are also just as applicable today as they were 45 years ago: "We are a people in a quandary about the present. We are a people in search of our future. We are people in search of a national community. We are people trying not only to solve the problems of the present, but we are attempting on a larger scale to fulfill the promise of America." When she passed away in 1996, she became the first African American to be buried among her fellow governors, senators, and congressmen in the Texas State Cemetery.

Barbara Jordan came from humble beginnings, but she worked her way through High School, College, and Law School in a heavily segregated country to achieve some of the highest ranks and honors in the U.S. Government. The youth at **The Imagine Society** are so inspired by her bravery and her advocacy and are motivated to carry on her legacy.






